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Objective of the MOU

The objective of the MOU is to build Industry-Academia linkage by sharing the knowledge and experience and there by bridging the gap between academic and industry requirements.

Whereas

- A. The first party M/s CED (Centre for entrepreneurship Development) was established to train, motivate, research and handhold perspective entrepreneurs.
- B. The second party approached the first party to conduct and organise entrepreneurship development programmes for the academic year 2023 – 2024.
- C. The first party has agreed to conduct and organise workshops, EACs, EDPs, ToTs, Industrial tours and Project Internship programmes for B.Tech. students at mutually decided by both parties for the academic year 2023 – 2024 as a part of industry academia interface and interactive session as and when conducted by CED.
- D. The first party agreed to facilitate, as per the terms and conditions mutually agreed upon, to support the ED cell at **Sumathi Reddy Institute of Technology for Women, Hasanparthy, Warangal** to create awareness about entrepreneurship, handholding support in setting up off their start ups, access to govt. schemes and formalities.
- E. The second party has agreed to access the incubation facilities that have been available at ALEAP Industrial Estate, Kukatpally and Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam Green industrial Park at Gaddiannaram, Patancheru Mandal
- F. The second party has agreed to support in developing the course content for different entrepreneurship programme(s), in faculty support when required, through CED staff on digital platform, free of cost.

Period of validity

The duration of the MoU will be a period of one year from the date of signing the MoU.

It is mutually understood and agreed by and between the parties that:

- A. **Modification:** Modification within the scope of the agreement shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all the parties, prior to any changes being performed.
- B. **Information ownership:** All information provided by CED shall only be utilised for the promotion of entrepreneurship development in the country.



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- C. **Termination:** Any of the parties inviting may terminate the agreement in whole or in part at any time before the date of expiration with a notice of 15 days, without detriment to ongoing programme.
- D. **Participation in similar activities:** This agreement in no way restricts CED from participating in similar activities with other public, private agencies, organisations and individuals. Likewise, this agreement does not restrict **Sumathi Reddy Institute of Technology for Women, Hasanparthy, Warangal** from participating in similar activities with other public, private agencies, organization and individuals.
- E. **Commencement/Expiration date:** This agreement valid for conducting training programme as indicated in the proposal. The period can be further extended by mutual MoU of three parties.
- F. **Authorised representative:** By signing below, the individuals signed in this document as representative of CED and **Sumathi Reddy Institute of Technology for Women, Hasanparthy, Warangal** are authorised to act in their respective areas for matters related to this MoU.
- G. **Establishment of responsibilities:** This MoU is intended to, and does not create any right, benefit or trust responsibility, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law, by a party against CED.
- H. **Arbitration:** It is agreed by all the parties that any difference of dispute in this connection shall be referred to Sole Arbitrator to be nominated by all the parties under the provisions of Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 and the award so given by the Arbitrator will be wholly binding on all the parties.
- I. **Jurisdiction:** Subject to the courts of Warangal & Hyderabad.
- J. **Liability:** Both the parties shall be jointly and severally liable to comply and fulfil all the obligations in this MoU.
- K. **Fairness and good faith:** The parties undertake to act in good faith with respect to each other's right under this MoU and to adapt all reasonable measures to ensure the realisations of the objectives of this MoU.
- L. **Force Majeure:** In the event of non-fulfilment of the contract terms and conditions due to any reason of force majeure namely Fires, Wars, Riots, Strikes, natural calamities, changes in the State and Central government directives etc., neither the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development, a unit of ALEAP, Sumathi Reddy Institute of Technology for Women, Hasanparthy, Warangal shall be held responsible for any non implementation of the clauses of the MoU and any loss or consequential loss.
